Re: Acknowledgement of Supplemental Request for Information Dated April 11, 2017  
Water/Lead Testing Results

Dear Dr. Wehr and Mr. Conwell,

On March 8, 2017, the University received the union's first request for information, submitted pursuant to Article 10.37, regarding lead and water testing results. On April 5, 2017, the University provided a complete response to that request, including relevant objections to that request. (Attachment A.) In an email dated April 11, 2017, the union submitted the following, supplemental response:

**I'm working on a formal response to your very limited response. In the meantime,**

- 1. The Consumer Quality Report was not attached to the document provided to us as indicated in your letter. <sup>1</sup>**
- 2. It is our understanding from Dr. Foran that in addition to the samples he took in January, he also took tests in March, 2016 and provided those to the University. We also understand that EH&S tested the water for lead in various locations including the childcare center. We request copies of those test results as well.**

**We are trying to find out which faculty members and their families have been exposed to lead so that they can take any health precautions that might be necessary to protect themselves.**

As to request #1, above, I apologize for failing to attach the reports. In an email dated April 11, 2017, I provided you the links to those reports. (Attachment B.) Please let me know if you have any trouble accessing the reports.

As to request #2, the University objects to this request as vague, overbroad, and requiring speculation, as well as being outside the scope of Article 10.37. Without waiving these objections, the University has located a PowerPoint provided by Dr. Foran. (Attachment C.) Testing results for the Child Development center, Sutter and Sierra halls, and UEI locations are also provided. (Attachment D.)

The sampling plan developed by the University's consultant, CIH Services, follows guidance provided by the EPA in their publication [\*3 T's for Reducing Lead in Drinking Water in Schools\*](#), and the State Water Resources Control Board's [\*Guidance for Collecting Drinking Water Samples for Lead Testing at K-12 Schools\*](#). Samples collected by UEI's consultant, CLS Laboratories, met all requirements.

Since the samples collected by EH&S did not conform to these recommendations with respect to stagnation times, the EH&S samples can be viewed as a screening tool but not used to determine the acceptance of a source as meeting the established limits nor can the EH&S samples be used to determine the risk of exposure. The data not collected in accordance with the above-referenced standards is on pages 40, 41, and 42-48. The University will defer to the study conducted by CIH Services for any final determination.
