Finally, the CFA Statewide support for the PAM (Palestine, Arab, Muslim) caucus in 2023 and the protests of last Spring caused some members to split off. Additionally, Ron attended the North Bay Labor Day Breakfast at the Teamsters Union Hall and made a point of greeting Congressman Huffman, as well as Tony Thurmond, who is State Superintendent of Education, and our former Colleague Andre Bailey who is running for Santa Rosa City School board.
